Hanukkah

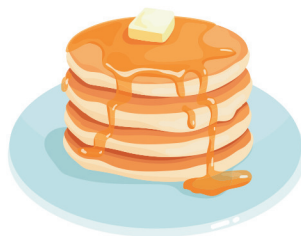


Hanukkah, is a special holiday celebrated by Jewish people around the world. It usually falls in December, and the celebration lasts for eight days. Hanukkah is known as the Festival of Lights, and it commemorates the miracle that happened long ago.

The story of Hanukkah dates back to more than 2,000 years ago when the Jewish people were living in Judea, which is now part of Israel. At that time, the Jewish temple was taken over by a king who did not allow the Jewish people to practice their religion freely. A group of brave Jewish fighters, known as the Maccabees, rose up against the king and reclaimed the temple.

When the Maccabees entered the temple, they found only a small jar of oil, enough to light the menorah (a special candle holder) for one day. However, a miracle happened! The oil lasted for eight days, allowing them to keep the menorah lit while they prepared more oil. This miracle is why Hanukkah is celebrated for eight days, and it is a time when Jewish families light the menorah, adding one candle each night.

During Hanukkah, families also play games with a spinning top called a dreidel and enjoy delicious foods like latkes (potato pancakes) and sufganiyot (jelly-filled doughnuts). It is a time for joy, gratitude, and spending quality time with loved ones.
