

All About Peacocks



Peacocks are colorful and beautiful birds that are famous for their large, bright tail feathers. They mostly live in forests and grasslands of India and Sri Lanka, but some peacocks can be found in other countries too. Male peacocks have long, shiny tail feathers with eye-like patterns that they spread to impress females. Female peacocks, called peahens, have smaller, brownish feathers.

Peacocks eat seeds, fruits, insects, and small animals. They have strong beaks that help them pick food from the ground or bushes. Peacocks are good at walking and running, but they can also fly short distances when they need to escape danger. They are active during the day, which makes them diurnal birds.

Baby peacocks are called chicks. They stay close to their mother and learn how to find food and stay safe. Peacocks make loud calls to communicate with each other, especially to warn about danger. They are important for nature because they help control insects and spread seeds in the forests.

Peacocks face threats from humans and habitat loss. People sometimes hunt them for their feathers or destroy the forests where they live. Wildlife groups and national parks help protect peacocks and their homes. Protecting peacocks ensures that these colorful birds continue to live happily in the wild.
