

# All About Lions



Lions are large, powerful animals that belong to the cat family. They are known as one of the strongest animals in the world. Many people call them the “King of the Jungle,” even though they do not actually live in jungles. Lions mostly live in the warm grasslands and savannas of Africa. These wide, open spaces give them plenty of room to hunt, explore, and rest. Lions are famous for their loud roar, which can be heard from as far as eight kilometers away.

Male lions are easy to recognize because they have a big, thick mane around their neck. Their manes can be golden, brown, or even black. The mane makes the male lion look bigger and helps protect him during fights. Female lions, called lionesses, do not have manes. They are smaller but very fast and strong. Baby lions, called cubs, are born with light brown fur covered in tiny spots. These spots help them hide from danger and slowly fade as they grow older.

Lions are one of the few types of big cats that live together in groups. A group of lions is called a pride. A pride usually has several lionesses, their cubs, and one or more male lions. Lionesses do most of the hunting. They work together in teams to catch animals like zebras, buffaloes, and antelopes. Male lions protect the pride from danger and other animals. Even though lions are skilled hunters, they spend most of their day resting. In fact, lions can sleep for sixteen to twenty hours every day.

Today, lions need protection to survive. Their habitats are shrinking because people build farms, roads, and towns on the land where lions used to live. When this happens, lions lose places to hunt and raise their cubs. Many wildlife groups and national parks are working hard to protect lions. They create safe areas where lions can live without danger. Saving lions helps keep nature healthy and balanced for all living things.
